Used for a bundle wrapping trials; unsuccessful. Booklets now offered in philatelic market.
8. John M. Deering sale catalog [date unknown; auction or net price sale?]: Lot 452 offers a booklet as described above, at £175.
9. Jacques C. Schiff, Jr. Sale 244, lot 1615. #1895 with black diagonal lines on back; [This was already on my reference list, but it is really not a test coil. It is a marking on a regular production coil to indicate defective stock. The marking was in use for only a limited time on one particular press. Since it was used in production, this may not be one I would consider to be a "test coil."] P2 VIN4 10/77
10. *The Phil Review* VIN2 4/77 P2 = VIN3 7/77 [Unknown publication, no date] Jackson, Mike. "Rolls: The Introduction of Stamps in Rolls (Part 1)" pp. 34-38. Describes earliest (1912) testing labels, a plain white paper and a paper overprinted "CANCELLED" in red or green. Describes 7 additional labels used subsequently. Article continued; details unknown.

Item 452 presents Australian test stamps, "P.M.G./DEPT." printed in black by photogravure, vertically coiled. Also shows "old style" solid vignette testing coil, said to be produced both in green and red, with red discontinued and now the scarcer. Another type of machine testing coil was supplied from overseas with each new vending machine.
