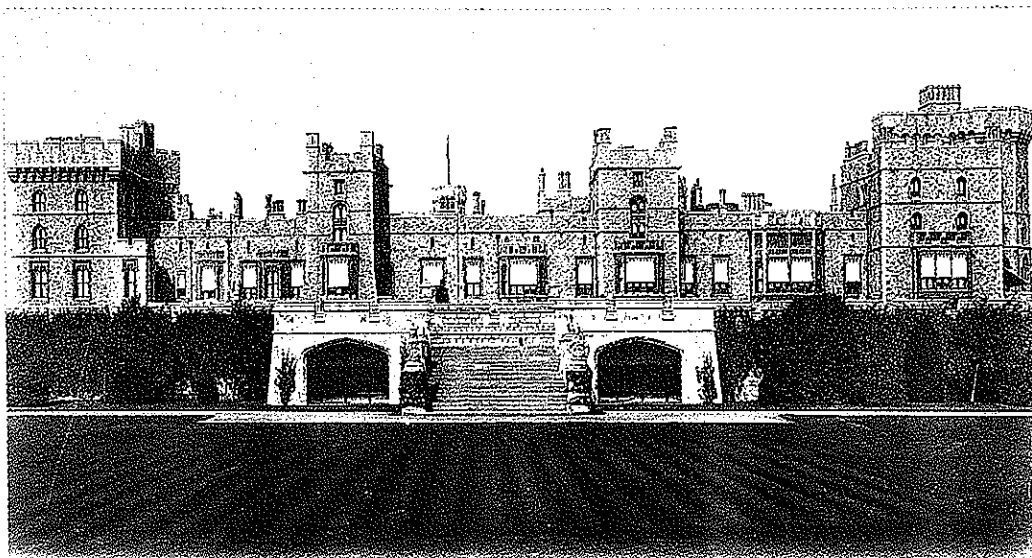
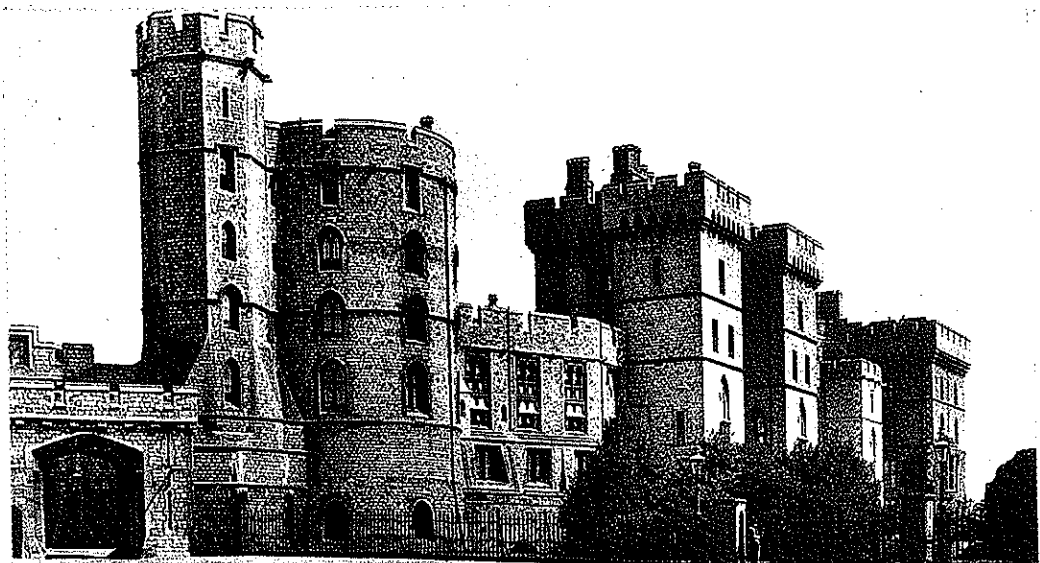

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POST OFFICE ARCHIVE REFERENCES

With over a mile and a half of shelving in its care, the Post Office Archive has been an unrivalled source of information in the compiling of this book. It is not claimed that every single reference to the Royal Family and Household has been included but it does gather together for the first time in one listing most of them for the convenience of fellow researchers.

It must be borne in mind that a lot of the "Minutes" are in fact only headings or very brief summaries as many of the original papers have been destroyed as part of an on-going policy.

Prior to British Telecom becoming responsible for telecommunications in this country the Post Office used to deal with such matters. The subject of this book relates to the postal service but details of telegraphs, private and direct wires and telephones have been included where considered to be of likely interest. Many such entries, therefore, have been omitted when considered to be of a minor nature. For example, an extra telephone extension in Room 215 at Buckingham Palace has not been included.

It is suggested that Jean Farrugia's book "A Guide to Post Office Archives" be obtained prior to making a visit as the Archive is somewhat daunting to those unfamiliar with such places. It is located at Freeling House, 23 Glasshill Street, Southwark, London, SE1 0BQ. It is not necessary to make an appointment in advance, although it can assist staff.
