"PLEASE READ ME FIRST"

Thank you for your interest in this e-catalogue. These notes may prove useful to you before and after downloading....

THE VOLUMES

BSE4.0 = All three volumes combined into one PDF BSE4.1 = Sheets, cards, labels and packs BSE4.2 = Souvenir stamp booklets BSE4.3 = British souvenir mail

CHOOSE WHICH PDF VERSION TO DOWNLOAD The catalogue is available as either a merged PDF edition containing all three catalogue sections (*ideal if you have a fast internet download connection and device, as the file size is larger*), or each volume may be downloaded separately.

Then choose between having an eTicks version, or a print at home version (both described below).

Each PDF works in the same way as any other PDF that you have accessed previously, with the advantage of eTicks, bookmarks and full searching.

START DOWNLOAD Click on the appropriate DOWNLOAD word that is alongside your chosen option and the PDF will start to load. When loading has finished (*i.e. the blue line moving from the left has reached the right and has then left the screen*), click on the down arrow with a bar below it (which signifies 'download' within Adobe).

You may now access the downloaded PDF by clicking on its file icon.

DIFFICULTY IN DOWNLOADING If you have a slow internet connection or device, you will benefit from downloading each volume separately, as file sizes will be smaller. However, be aware that any PDF can, at times, "freeze" when downloading is underway, especially with larger files.

If this happens, simply use your back arrow key and resubmit your download request. PDF downloads have successfully been tested on several devices.

CATALOGUE WITH eTICKS Much time was spent adding 3,624 electronic tick boxes to **BSE4.0**, **BSE4.1** and **BSE4.2** thus enabling you to record your collection within the PDF and even share with other collectors.

Simply find an item that you own and click the appropriate pale blue solid area alongside it and a tick will appear *(click again and the tick will vanish)*. It is worth noting that you MUST click SAVE when prompted or your added ticks will not be there next time, as with any file that has been amended.

To test eTicks, try the sample below:

Note that **BSE4.3** is not available as an eTicks version because the sheets, cards, labels, presentation packs and booklets are already listed in **BSE4.0**, **BSE4.1** or **BSE4.2**, while the postmarks and covers have negligible collector interest.

BOOKMARKS Every section and new subject has a bookmark shown at left of screen. This enables you to jump around rapidly by clicking on your chosen word, without the need to scroll through every page until you find what you want - essential for such a large work as the catalogue.

This small document has been bookmarked to let you sample the idea. Ideally choose an item from page one or three, or the document will not change pages! Then click on the bookmarked word **BOOKMARKS** to return to this point and continue reading.

INDEX AND SEARCHING There is no index provided. This is because unlike with a printed book every single word is indexed within the document. By pressing and holding down the Control (CTRL) key, plus the letter "F" from within Windows *(other platforms will work similarly),* a search box appears into which you may type an appropriate keyword to search for. Try a word from within this document now.

PRINTING FROM HOME Separate PDFs are included as an option for those wishing to print volumes or individual pages and tick-off items held in their collection traditionally with a pen.

For technical reasons, do **not** download the eTicks version when only intending to print a hard copy, as all pre-printed empty tick boxes will be concealed, owing to how Adobe is formatted.

DISK LABELS Use for your own disks when creating back-ups housed in disk cases. Either print the label for all volumes combined (**BSE4.0**), or produce separate labels for each volume (**BSE4.1**, **BSE4.2** and **BSE4.3**). This is entirely optional, as you may choose simply to rely on your device-held version that you downloaded, securely backing-up as you go, as with any other file.

DISK CASE SLEEVES Print-off and use these when creating one disk case for all volumes (**BSE4.0**), or separate cases for each volume (**BSE4.1**, **BSE4.2** and **BSE4.3**).

MARKETING SHEET If you are able to promote this free e-catalogue on your own website, then you are invited to use the single-sided 'Marketing Sheet' PDF. Similarly, if you are able to print-off a copy and display it at a society meeting, then that would also be appreciated. As authors, we believe that philatelic knowledge is for sharing.

AND FINALLY... *"WHY IS THERE NO PRINTED VERSION AVAILABLE?"* With 1,730 full-colour pages, the number of collectors willing to pay even cost price would be minimal, making each copy an exorbitant price. Printed stock would also have to be stored, while postage and packing would substantially add to the cost. We trust that you will understand our decision to go electronic only.

Those requiring a hard copy have the option to download the "print from home" version, but they should expect high ink costs. Alternatively, a local print shop may be approached for a quote.
